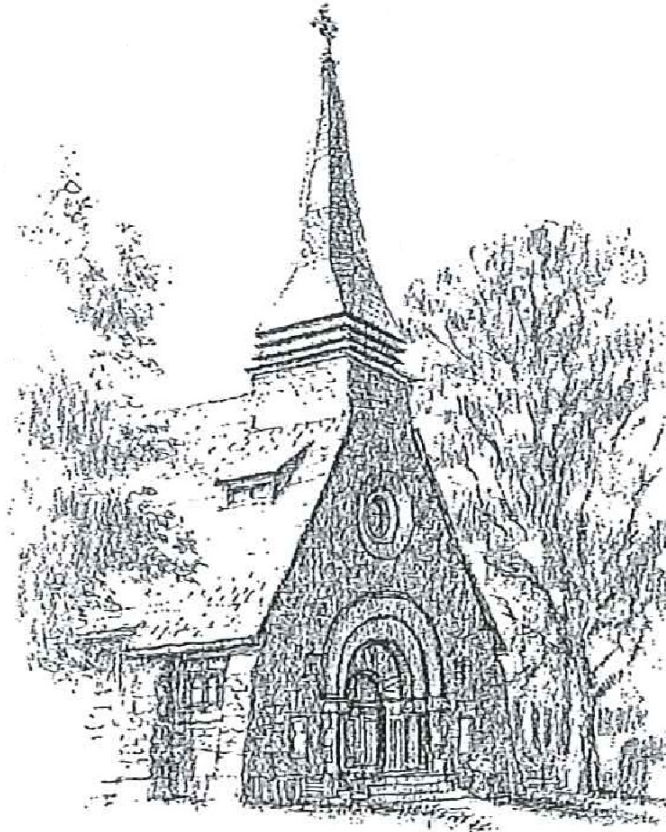

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

During our October Family Meeting, families viewed a power point based on following scripture, *“I am the living bread that came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever. And the bread that I will give is My Flesh for the life of the world.”* (John 6: 51). Parents and children also discussed excerpts from the book *“7 Secrets of the Eucharist”* by Vinny Flynn. Families then created beautiful posters to share with the parish. Each poster is based on one of three secrets from the book. All are invited to view the amazing posters that are on display in the church hall.

ALL SOULS OBSERVANCE

Friday, November 2, is the Feast of the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, commonly known as All Souls Day. It is the longstanding tradition of the Church to remember the Deceased at Mass on that day, and an important way in which to fulfill the Fourth Commandment of honoring and praying for our parents and grandparents who are deceased. If you would like to include a Loved One among the intentions of the day, as well as on all the Fridays of November, simply fill out one of the envelopes in the pew, or in your envelope packet, and drop it in the Collection basket at Mass over the next few Sundays. Other options would be to mail the envelope or bring it directly to the Rectory/Office. The names you submit will be inscribed in the Book of the Dead, which will be placed in the sanctuary of the church on All Souls Day and will remain there through the month of November, until the First Sunday of Advent.

BOOK OF THE DEAD

During November, we are called in a special way to remember “our brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep in the just hope of the resurrection”. If you would like to include a Loved One among the intentions at all the Masses throughout the month of November, come by the rectory and the name will be added. The names you submit will be placed in the Book of the Dead, which will be placed in the sanctuary of the church on All Souls Day and will remain there through the month of November, until the First Sunday of Advent.
